The opening of the newly constructed Reiyukai Eko Masunaga Eye Hospital



On 25th March 2015, the newly constructed Reiyukai Eko Masunaga Eye Hospital, situated at Banepa, district Kavrepalanchok in Nepal, was ceremonially inaugurated by the blessed hand of the Founder President of Eurasia Reiyukai Mr. Yushun Masunaga. The programme was witnessed by 1641 members.

The following are the excerpt summary from the deliberation made by the President at the programme:

1. Having constructed a building like this eye Hospital, it is like building a better eternal light's stupa and such stupas should be built more and more.
2. This building is the result of the virtuous merit of those people who are rich by heart and there is need of more and more Nepali citizens.
3. Fish live in water but are not grateful to it. We, human beings, too are not grateful to the air, which we breathe to live. Eurasia Reiyukai has been teaching us to become grateful.
4. Eurasia Reiyukai has availed us with the opportunity to organise citizen's cleanliness programme on every Saturday in Nepal and on every Sunday in India. But the management of the garbage has not been properly done.
5. Please realise the existence of another person and extend your support to fulfil the need of other persons.
6. It is necessary to think about our nation and we must guide our youths to think in the same way. This should be done by leading from the front.
