SHORT INTRODUCTION OF EURASIA REIYUKAI

Mahaguru Kakutaro Kubo and Kimi Kotani, two co-founders of Reiyukai had initiated the teaching of Reiyukai in the year 1920 in Japan. The teaching of Reiyukai was based on Sadharmapundarik Sutra, formulated by Buddha. Reiyukai means strong spiritual bond in a society. The practitioners of the teaching of Reiyukai have their faith in this spiritual world and worship our ancestors who are the main sources of our life.

Inventing and practicing Reiyukai teaching respectively deo-mahaguru went on to move further in their process and institutionalized it in the year 1930 in Japan. After this our founder President of Eurasia Reiyukai Mr. Yushun Masunaga introduced Reiyukai teaching for the first time in India in the year 1977.

At the present moment, we have the opportunity of practicing the great Reiyukai teaching in the countries Eurasia continent's such as India, Nepal, Bangladesh and Myanmar.

The main objective of the Reiyukai teaching is to produce more and more individuals who can contribute for the world peace.

According to the founder President of Eurasia Reiyukai the mode of conducting one's life is based on Sadharmapundarik sutra for day to day life, would make the family and every human society invariably prosperous. This particular mode of Reiyukai Teaching may have its practical utility in the life of common people as well. Once a person is initiated into the Reiyukai and ordained as Oya he may help others too, with the feeling as his to get into the initial stage of the Reiyukai Teaching. After the initial ceremony the members of Reiyukai will have to follow the three main observing rules namely (1) worship of the ancestors (2) purification of own's life with reference to one's karmic relation (3) and practicing to go further the higher plain of living through repentance or penance.

Enshrining Sokaimyo at our home as the symbol of our late ancestors, offering water & chanting Sutra is to preserve sacred souls of the dead ones. Respectively we called this process "Purkha Smaran". The karmic relation of our ancestors followed with our birth as our inheritance. Our duty becomes significantly important to separate the good karma and eliminate the bad karma from our life long activities, as the ritual that goes to purify our personalities..

Committing of our mistakes we should make it a practice of penance for what has been done. We believe in putting into practice the three main pillars of Reiyukai's teaching that brings about necessary changes in our life. The members of Reiyukai formally initiated, who offers water at the "Gohoza" and worships the ancestors faithfully is what is called according to custom, "The Michibiki". Reiyukai is not in any way related to religion & politics.

All irrespective of their political convection and religious following have their ancestors and can have the liberty of becoming the members of Reiyukai and can practice it. Besides imparting Reiyukai teaching occasionally we organized various kinds of training & health camps. To add to the list of trainings camps the following other important ones-

(1) Training for enhancement of skills. (2) Cleaning. (3) Relief measures against natural calamity. (4) Free health check-up camps. (5) Provision of Ambulance Service to the needy and linguistic camps etc.

We believe in Reiyukai Teaching being able to perform on the basis of its practice to do good to our own family and in a way that may work out the benefit in Social Plain which may ultimately cater to the human benefit establishing the world peace.



My good name is Parbati Shrestha. My residence is located under the district of Morang. At present I stay at Kusunti within the district of Lalitpur. My Michibiki Oya is Sudha Gujurel who introduced me to Reiyukai. I got the opportunity to join Reiyukai in 9th Sept. 2008. When I was reading in 6th standard, our teacher told me to participate in the dance and elocution competition organized by the



Reiyukai. Friends along with myself went to Reiyukai office for the competition. When I attended that programme I had a peculiar feeling because senior persons welcomed us (the juniors) smilingly with folded hands. I wondered, why the seniors welcomed the juniors in such polite way. I came to know at my later stage that it was to establish a cordial relation among us all and it was common way of greeting everyone wherever they met. On that day I came to know that the purpose of being in the Reiyukai was to pay respect to our ancestors and to be able to do something for the world peace according to our might. Though I was very much impressed by the objective of Reiyukai but I could not take up its membership as I was merely student and being no money with me to be able to pay for the membership. Although I was very much disappointed, deep in my heart, I made up mind to be its member one day by saving the Tiffin money given by my father it was my intention with which I returned home

It gave me pleasure that I come across a person as my next door neighbor whom I was searching for quite some time. I enquired of him what should be the procedure of becoming the member of Reiyukai. At that moment I was happy, I got the way how I could get into the Reivukai. He introduced me to his family members and exploited to me everything about Reiyukai by showing me the Gohoza that he had put up his residence. By writing an application for the membership, I came back home in a jovial mood.

On obtaining the membership of Reiyukai I began attending the regular meetings customarily held on the 9th & 18th of every month

at the office of the Eurasia Reiyukai 11th Branch.

In this context, I have to mention that I got the opportunity of learning the practical aspect of the teaching of the Reiyukai. In the Reiyukai what I liked best was to say "I am sorry!" and thank you very much that the members exchanged with each other with a good gesture of smiles. I was very much impressed with the motto of Reiyukai of remembering our ancestors without any difference of gender.

I got the opportunity of worshiping our ancestors by symbiocally enshrined them in the form of Sokaimyo and by offering them water. And then I have started making new members in the process and have also been given them instructional teaching of Reiyukai by encouraging to attend the Reiyukai's monthly gatherings. Last year I attended the leadership training programme which was held in Sthirmati Mountain by attending which I could have a closure view of in-depth study of the teaching of Reiyukai. On completion of the leadership training camp when I came back I seemed to have been little more enthused to attain the level of Michibiki. And at this stage I attended the rituals held at the residence of those persons and families who were already accomplished 'Michibiki' and by taking whose help I took part in the ritualistic performances of installing Sokaimyo along with the Oya. After my being part and parcel of Reiyukai, a good many positive changes have come about me. In the process of my going for the daily business of life I found myself lucky enough to go into the practical use of giving smiles while meeting and parting. By noting my behavior with the difference of time what I was before and how I behave at this juncture my neighbors have their remarks to say that the Parbati of today has different of "hell & haven" than what she was yesterday. I express my deep feeling of gratitude to the respected founder president who brought Reiyukai's Teaching in the land of Eurasia.

Hence, I will follow the principle of personally rendering into practice and try to help as best I can, and try to help others do the same.
